Guest lectures, campus programs, and applied professional learning

Programs connect standards, research, orientation and mobility, and firsthand nonvisual navigation with the decisions that shape transportation and campus environments. Each session is adapted to the discipline and learning goals of the host.

Program options

Seeing the Intersection Differently

For engineering, planning, design, orientation and mobility, and related programs. Students learn how people navigating nonvisually identify and use intersection information, why accessible pedestrian standards are written as they are, and how design and installation details affect the finished environment.

One Banana Peel Away: Designing a World That Works When Life Changes

A broad campus program about disability, design assumptions, and the ordinary uncertainty of human life. The session invites audiences to see accessibility as practical preparation for the range of bodies and circumstances a community will include.

The Next Usable Cue: Five Principles for Moving Forward When the Route Changes

A broad program for students, emerging professionals, leadership programs, and campus audiences. Drawing from nonvisual navigation, the session offers five practical principles for making progress when the whole route is not yet clear.

Available formats

- 60-to-90-minute guest lecture or campus program, starting at \$750
- Class visits, faculty or staff development, and multidisciplinary panels
- Bundled campus visit with two or more sessions, quoted by scope
- In-person delivery preferred; live virtual delivery available
